Academic Policies

Class Attendance

Students are expected to attend <u>all sessions</u> of courses for which they are registered.

Course Registration

After sending us the Exchange Data Form, we will register you in the registration system. You are still able to add or drop your courses within the first week of the module.

Note: Sasin does not have a textbook/course material return/refund policy. So students should not purchase textbook/course materials until they are definitely sure that they will not drop the course.

Course Load

Sasin students take <u>two courses per module</u>. Exchange students can take first or second year courses. Each course is usually worth 3 Sasin credits which is 33 contact hours (including exam hours).

Visa Information

Getting your Entry Document and Visa

To enter Thailand, you need to obtain a visa by presenting the letter issued by Sasin and other necessary documents to the nearest Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate. The visa granted to an exchange student is usually a <u>single or multiple-entry</u> student "ED" visa valid for three months or less. If you have a single-entry visa and wish to travel outside of Thailand during your stay here, you <u>must apply for a re-entry permit before leaving Thailand so your student visa will not be terminated.</u>

How to apply for a Re-Entry Permit

If you want to leave Thailand, students with a single-entry visa must apply for a re-entry permit to the Kingdom of Thailand at the Immigration Bureau **before** you leave the country. Students have the option to apply for a single or multiple permits. The fees* are 1,900 Baht for a single permit and more for a multiple permit. The applicant or passport holder must go in person and fill out the TM.8 application form. Do not forget to bring your passport, photograph (4 x 6 cm) and application fee. The application fee is not refundable. The Student Affairs Office can give you information about the nearest Immigration Bureau.

Accommodation

On-Campus Housing

The Sasa International House, located within a 3-minute walk from Sasin. Room rates are 1,800 baht per night/room or 30,000 baht/month* (*includes room cleaning service*). Due to the limitation of vacancies at the Sasa International House, we suggest you to make a reservation through e-mail: sasahouse@sasin.edu.

*Note: The monthly rate will start on the first day of the month so if you come in the middle of the month, it might be cheaper to pay the daily rate.

CU iHouse – Chulalongkorn U., a short walk from Sasin. They have a monthly rental but are <u>very strict on the contract</u> e.g. *if you state that you will stay for two months then you will have to pay for two months even if you ended up staying for one month. They will also not return your deposit if you decide to stay less than your contract.* You will have to <u>pay in cash</u> (they do not accept credit cards). The daily rental rate is 1,000 baht/room/night and the monthly rate is 14,000 baht/month (twin room – 2 beds). When you check-in, you have to make a two-months room deposit and one-month rental fee so a total of 42,000 baht. They will return the two-months deposit after you check-out (as long as you stay the full contract).

Note: They do not provide bath towels or bedding items such as bed sheets, blankets, and pillowcases. Our Sasin Student Affairs Office can take you to a low-priced supermarket (Tesco Lotus) nearby CU-iHouse to purchase these items when you arrive.

Off-Campus Housing

Exchange students have enjoyed staying at service apartments that are 20 minutes walking distance away from Sasin or a short taxi ride from Sasin. Contact our office for more information at <u>studentaffairs@sasin.edu</u>.

Note: Do not stay at "Court Capri" also known as "Capri Court"– our exchange students had problems there and the place is not a reliable place to stay at. Sasin and Sasin staff cannot guarantee assistance with legal matters or disagreements between exchange students and off-campus housing units.

<u>At Sasin</u>

Your first day at Sasin

You should report to Ms. Siratas Keshagupta, Head of Admissions & Student Affairs Office, on the 6th floor of Sasa Patasala Building on the orientation day (usually held on the Monday or a day before the module starts). Your presence on the orientation day is recommended for obtaining your Sasin Student ID and other Sasin information. There is also a short Sasin facility tour. Please

also bring a copy of your passport (personal information and visa pages) for our files. In addition, please provide us with your contact number (mobile/cell phone) in Bangkok.

"Experience Thai Culture" Day

If the module schedule timing permits, newly arrived exchange students will be taken on a half-day trip to one of the most famous attractions in Bangkok, which can be *the Grand Palace Complex* (*Wat Phra Keo*) or another cultural site.

Sasin Facilities

• IT Facilities

Computer Lab – Sasin has a computer lab open every day for students to use. Exchange students should bring their own laptop since Sasin does not provide a laptop loan service.

Electronic Mailing - We will provide all exchange students with their own user name and password to access the Sasin system. Each student will also receive a Sasin e-mail address, you can forward your Sasin e-mail to your primary account.

Recreational Facilities

Sasin provides recreational facilities for their students such as a swimming pool, fitness center, aerobic center, and sauna at the Sasabol Health and Recreation Center. There is also the University recreational center a few minutes walk from the school.

Note: Students not staying at the Sasa International House will have to pay \$15 per module (five weeks) to use the facilities.

Health Services

Students can visit the Chulalongkorn Health Center (on campus) or Student Affairs Office (overthe-counter medicines such as Tylenol, Actifed, etc.)

• Laundry Services

There are laundry services (do-it-yourself coin operated) and dry cleaner stores around the oncampus housing areas.

• Student Locker

Exchange students can request for their own lockers to store their belongings. Lockers are located on the 6th floor. *There is a 500 Baht locker key deposit which will be returned to students after the locker key has been returned.*
