Academic Policies

Class Attendance

Students are expected to attend *all* sessions of registered courses. Do not plan trips during a module (e.g., for weekends or holidays) until classes are underway because timetables are subject to last-minute adjustments.

Course Registration

Registration takes place a few weeks before the module starts. You can add or drop courses up to the end of the first week of the module.

Note: Students should not purchase textbook/course materials until they are confident that they will continue with the course because all sales are final and no refunds are possible.

Course Load

Sasin students take two courses per module. Exchange students can take first or second year courses. Each course is usually worth 3 Sasin credits which is 33 contact hours (including exam hours). Intensive courses are also worth 3 Sasin credits.

Visa Information

Following are typical expenses for a one-month period in Bangkok:

Getting your Entry Document and Visa

To enter Thailand, you need to obtain a visa by presenting a Sasin-issued letter as part of your visa application to the nearest Royal Thai Embassy or Consulate. Normally you will receive a single or multiple-entry student "ED" type non-immigrant visa valid for three months or less. **Important:** If you receive a single-entry visa and wish to travel outside of Thailand during your stay here, you must apply for a re-entry permit before leaving Thailand. If you do not do this, your student visa will be terminated and you will be forced to travel abroad to re-apply.

How to apply for a Re-Entry Permit

To leave Thailand, students with a single-entry visa must apply for a re-entry permit at the Immigration Bureau or at the airport <u>before</u> leaving the country. You may request a single entry or multiple entries. The fees are 1,900 Baht for a single permit and considerably more for a multiple permit. You must apply in person and submit a TM 8 application form. Do not forget to bring your passport and a photograph (4 x 6 cm) along with the application fee. (The fee is not refundable.) Student Services can give you information about the nearest Immigration Bureau, or you can obtain a re-entry permit at the airport as you depart Thailand. Health Insurance (Required)

We require all exchange students to have international health insurance to cover accidents and health/medical issues during their time at Sasin. You may optionally purchase additional Thai insurance (accident only) through Sasin while here. The estimated cost* is:

- One module = approximately 2,400.00 Baht
- Two modules = approximately 4,900.00 Baht

Important: Exchange students must advance hospital payments at the time of treatment and claim reimbursement later. You will need to provide your insurance company with payment receipt(s) and a doctor's report for reimbursement.

Accommodation

On-Campus Housing



The Sasa International House, closest to Sasin, located within a three-minute walk. Rates are 28,800 baht/month (includes room cleaning service but excludes breakfast & electricity). Please inform Student Services if you would like to book a room.



CU iHouse – Chulalongkorn University, is a short walk from Sasin, just off campus. Monthly rates but with strict terms: if you commit to a two month stay, you will pay for that period even if you leave earlier. They will not return your deposit if you stay less than the contracted period. Daily rental rate is 1,000 baht/room/night, and the monthly rate is 14,000 baht/month (twin room with two beds). Upon check in, you must present a two-month room deposit and the one month rental fee, for a total of 42,000 baht. They return the two month deposit after checkout (provided you have stayed to term.)

Note: CU iHouse does not provide towels or linens or blankets. Student Services can introduce you to a budget supermarket (Tesco Lotus) where you can purchase these items. (Student rooms are organized dormitory-style into male and female floors.)

At Sasin

Your first day at Sasin

Report in a timely fashion to Ms. Siratas Keshagupta, Head of Admissions & Student Services, on the 6th floor of Sasa Patasala Building on Orientation Day (you will be notified of the date, which is usually on a Saturday or the day before your module begins). On Orientation Day you will be issued your Sasin Student ID, you will pay for insurance (if desired), and you will receive a thorough Sasin introduction. There is also a short Sasin facility tour. Please also bring a photocopy of your passport personal information and visa pages for our files. In addition, please be sure to provide your address and contact number (mobile/cell phone) in Bangkok.

Enjoy "Thai Culture" Day

If the module schedule timing permits, newly arriving exchange students will join a half day trip to one of Bangkok's more renowned attractions-the Grand Palace Complex (Wat Phra Keo) or a similar cultural site.

Sasin Facilities



IT Facilities

Exchange students should bring their own laptops since Sasin does not offer a laptop loan service and there is no IT Lab.



Electronic Mailing

We will provide all exchange students with a user name and password to access the Sasin system. Each student will also receive a Sasin email address for official School communications.



Laundry Services

There are coin-operated laundry machines and dry cleaning services in the on campus housing areas.



Health Services

Students can access the Chulalongkorn Health Center (on campus) or Student Services (for over-the-counter medicines such as Tylenol, Actifed, etc.)



Recreational Facilities

The Chulalongkorn University Recreational Center is only a five-minute walk from the school and is free for exchange students to use. There are also a number of commercial fitness centers in the vicinity of the campus.



Student Lockers

Exchange students can request personal lockers to store belongings. These lockers are located on the 6th floor. There is a 500 Baht locker key deposit, refunded after the locker key has been returned.
