Academic requirements

Exchange students are required to take at least 4 courses at KBS, irrespective of the requirements by their home institutions.

Contact hours of each courses are 30 hours (equivalent to 90 minutes × 20 sessions) with 27 classroom hoursa nd woth 2 KBS credits.

LIVING IN JAPAN

Housing

University dormitories are not available for exchange students. Exchange students need to find their accommodations in Japan themselves. Exchange students must take this information into consideration before applying for the exchange at KBS. Several resources to support students finding housing is available upon inquiry.

Natoinal Health Insurance

It is mandatory that all foreign nationals subscribe to Japanese National Health Insurance (NHI, or Kokuho in Japanese) which exchange students can apply to at their local city offices. Visa

Exchange students will apply to Student Visa. Each student is responsible for obtaining their own visa, and are advised to contact the nearest Japanese Embassy/Consulate for details on application procedures. For their visa application, exchange students need a document called Certificate of Eligibility (CoE). KBS will assist exchange students prepare the application for their CoE and apply for CoE to the Immigration Bureau on their behalf. KBS will send it to each school's exchange coordinator. Students will be informed of the details well in advance before the departure.

Please note that questions regarding visas should always be directed to the Japanese Embassy/Consulate.
